JUROR STATEMENT

It was a pleasure judging this year's RAM exhibition of Indiana and Ohio artists and artisans. The variety and scope of artistic expression was impressive, from beautiful craftsmanship in wood and clay, to plein air and figurative painting.

Really fine drawing is rare enough in today's exhibitions - particularly those which feature the subtle dance between accuracy of shape and interpretation of form. The drawing that won this year's top award exhibits all these qualities and more; sensitivity of line, loving attention to the poetic possibilities of curvilinear shapes and a strong characterization.

On the landscape front, there seems always to be much in the way of robust plein air painting today. The one-session on-the-spot bravura sketch, many quite large, rules the day in most of our exhibitions. They have undeniable appeal and for good reason. But it is rare to find the sustained effort, over time, of repeated visits to the same location. Where the aim is subtlety of expression, and careful nuance of edge, color and value relations, such pieces stand out. The top landscape award winner exhibits these qualities, and skillfully adds the difficult to cultivate sense of a single unified visual impression of the whole over the individual parts. These were also awarded top prizes.

Congratulations to those that made it in the show. Your focus on good drawing skills, craftsmanship, fine design and good composition was satisfying to see.







When the fiscal year began on June 1, 2021, RAM was still adjusting to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Yet our donors, patrons and students showed up in record numbers to attend our exhibitions, special events and educational programs.


were always with the arts. Berthelsen would become a singer, actor, painter and teacher. He enjoyed a rich and varied career, touring the US and Canada in operas, concerts, Gilbert & Sullivan, and operettas.

In 1913, at the age of 30, he became the youngest ever head of the voice department at the Indianapolis Conservatory of Music. It was during this time that he began a friendship with painter, Wayman Adams. They would remain friends for the remainder of their lives. Adams painted many portraits of Berthelsen including a life-sized image of his friend preparing to go on stage that is on view in Starr Gallery.

In 1920, seeking to advance their careers, Berthelsen and Adams moved to New York, where both achieved rapid success. Although self-taught, he benefited from the company of other artists such as Svend Svendsen (1864-1944) and learned much from their comments and observations. Berthelsen was elected to the American Watercolor Society in 1925 and the Salmagundi Club in 1935.

Today, Berthelsen is recognized for his New York winter scenes with iconic American flags waving. These popular subjects, bursting with movement, were acquired by many famous people including Frank Sinatra, William Randolph Hearst and Richard Berlin.

The museum is grateful to Lee Berthelsen for selecting the Richmond Art Museum as the repository for his father's work and legacy. Lee believes strongly in RAM's mission of exhibiting Indiana artists and stewardship of our collection.



Berthelsen Gift

In 2021, Lee Berthelsen, son of American artist, Johann Berthelsen (1883-1972), generously gifted over 150 artworks by his father to the Richmond Art Museum permanent collection. RAM now is the repository for the largest amount of work by Johann Berthelsen in the country. The gift also includes many works by Wayman Adams (1883-1959), who was a close personal friend of Berthelsen.

Born in Copenhagen in 1883, Berthelsen was one of seven sons and the sone of a tenor with the Royal Opera. In 1890, his mother brought the children to America, settling in Michigan and would eventually live in Manitowoc, Wisconsin. Although Berthelsen worked at several trades, his mind and heart


